School Culture has become much stronger and student's are feeling more empowered to voice their concerns and opinions. This is attributed to increased culturally diverse courses, enhanced CTE courses as well as more opportunities of engagement during and after school.

Parent/Family engagement have always been difficult to give strong feedback. Therefore, this year we have increases supports for organizing and providing supports for more volunteer opportunities within the community.

Community engagement has greatly increased within the school due primarily from the increased supports for more volunteer opportunities. This has not only been beneficial for the community in the classrooms, but also to provide more engagement among our diverse electives we are now offering which attracts volunteers to come in and share their knowledge with the students.

This past year has been focused on providing tools to students which will help them beyond the classroom. We have brought in a big Culinary program which the students in all K-12 grades have benefitted from and has strengthened our school community as well as giving students a broader view of opportunities after school. In addition, we are adding in a lot more hands on coursework through gardening, drumming and dancing schoolwide in order to increase engagement.
