- a. *Dr. Karen Gray Making Connections.* Dr. Gray discussed with the board the Lincoln County School District's Strategic Plan and the efforts made to improve Indian Education and Native curriculum through LCSD. - b. *Debra Barnes Elementary Update.* 2nd Grade paired up with High School Science for a Science project. Teachers are looking at expanding K-12 group projects. K-5 teachers are continuing PLC planning and student support.
- c. *Liz Guilford Literacy Curriculum Findings.* Liz shared about the Amplify ELA curriculum. The projects and work are engaging, diverse, and have improved testing scores. About 8 students' Edmentum ELA score improved by 100%, compared to last year.
- d. Nessa Arnold Math Curriculum Update. Nessa shared about the different pros and cons of three math curriculum that the K-12 team is looking into for next school year. Bridges (K-5), EnVision (K-12), and HMH (K-12). Three teachers have taught sample lessons of each curriculum. She is having a table at Parent/Teacher Conferences to get parent feedback.

- Sam shared that the face mask transition is going smoothly and students are being very respectful. Parent/teacher conferences are this Wednesday and Thursday. Spring Break is March 21-25. The After School Program has started doing the Super Readers program. Woodshop students are going to build picnic tables and donate one to both CTSI & the City of Siletz.
